Description and goals

This seminar aims at developing a concept and method of measuring impact in cross-border investigative journalism (CBJ). It introduces the participants to the functioning and state of CBJ in Europe as well as theoretical and practical aspects of impact in investigative journalism. Via readings, classroom discussions, and conversations with online guests, the participants will get acquainted with the key notions, figures, and outlets of CBJ in Europe. The participants are expected to collectively develop a method for measuring the impact of investigative stories, which will help them work in groups to evaluate the impact generated by investigations nominated for the 2024 IJ4EU Impact Award in the second half of the semester. Thus, theory and practice will come together allowing the participants to gain a deeper understanding about CBJ and actively partake in the pre-evaluation process of a prestigious investigative journalism award in Europe.

Exam performance

The grading of this seminar will be based on two components:

- 1. The scientific evaluation of the investigative stories for the impact they generated, which will be handed it to the lecturer in pre-distributed forms by each working group, to be handed in by 27 June. (60%)
- 2. An essay discussing the potential methods and their shortcomings of measuring impact in cross-border investigative journalism, to be handed in by 11 July (2000 words). (40%)

More details will be provided throughout the semester.

The participants of the seminar are expected to do the compulsory readings in preparation, regularly attend and actively contribute to the discussions and exercises throughout the seminar. In case of illness, sick leave, or other emergencies, please make sure to inform the lecturer by e-mail in a timely manner.

Please note that this seminar will be held and evaluated entirely in English.
